OB-/OP-OB-/OP(against, toward, to, on, over)


- **Object**: a material thing that can be seen and touched.
- **Oppose**: to resist or contend against.
- **Obstruct**: to block or prevent passage.
- **Obvious**: easily perceived or understood.




OCT (Latin root: eight)

- Octagon: a figure with eight sides.
- Octave: a series of eight notes in music.
- October: the tenth month of the year (originally the eighth month in the Roman calendar)
- Octopus 8 armed





OCUL (eye)




- Ocular: of or connected with the eyes or sight.
- **Monocle**: a single eyeglass, typically attached to a ribbon or cord.
- **Spectacles** glasses or something to look at
- Oculus VR headset



-OD (path, way)

- **Episode**: an event or a group of events occurring as part of a larger sequence.
- **Period**: a length or portion of time.
- Method: a particular procedure for accomplishing or approaching something.



OMN (all, every)

- Omniscient: knowing everything.
- Omnipotent: having unlimited power.
- Omnivore: an animal or person that eats plants and animals.
- Omnipresent never leave always there

OMNIVORE ANIMALS

Omnivore animals are those that consume both plant and animal matter for their diet.





OPT (Greek root: sight, view)

- Optic: relating to the eye or sight.
- Optical: relating to vision or the study of light.
- Optimize: to make the best or most effective use of a situation or resource (related to having a clear view of the best approach).






OPHTHALM (Greek root: eye)

- Ophthalmology: the branch of medicine concerned with the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye.
- Ophthalmic: relating to the eye.



ORB (Latin root: circle, round)

- **Orbit:** the path of a celestial body or an artificial satellite around a planet or star.
- Orbital: relating to an orbit.
- Exorbitant: (of a price or amount) unreasonably high; going beyond the usual or proper limits (literally "out of the circle").



ORNITH (bird)

- Ornithology: the scientific study of birds.
- Ornithopter: an aircraft that flies by flapping its wings.



ORTH (Greek root: straight, correct)

- Orthography: the correct spelling of words.
- Orthodontist: a dentist who specializes in the straightening of teeth.
- Orthodox: conforming to traditional or accepted standards; not unconventional.







ORA, OS

(Latin root: mouth)

- Oral: relating to the mouth.
- Oration: a formal speech.
- Osculate: (formal or humorous) to kiss (related to the movement of the mouth).
